Lecture Topic: Invasive Cervical Resorption: Conceptions and Misconceptions

Lecture Synopsis: Invasive Cervical Resorption (ICR) is a relatively uncommon type of resorption. Our general knowledge on ICR is limited and research in this area has not been able to provide clinicians useful guidelines on protocols for diagnosis, treatment, and management. As a result, diagnosis and treatment strategies are mostly based on clinical experience and published case reports or case series at best which at time are subject to disagreements or confusion. This lecture aims to address 10 most common concepts related to ICR and attempts to clarify its veracity by using the highest quality and most up-to-date scientific evidence.

Learning Objectives: At the conclusion of this lecture, the participants should be able to:

1. Compare and contrast the mechanism of different types of root resorption.
2. Distinguish ICR from caries and other anomalies.
3. Identify different types of ICR.
4. Discuss outcome assessment in ICR repair treatments.

About the Speaker: Matthew Malek, DDS



Dr. Malek received his certificate in the specialty of endodontics from NYU Dentistry in 2011. He was appointed as a full-time faculty immediately after graduation, a position he still holds. He is a recipient of the Arthur Charles Hull and Samuel and Hannah Holzman Award for showing the greatest proficiency in Endodontics and the recipient of the American Dental Education Association (ADEA) J. Faculty Award in 2014. Dr. Malek is a Diplomate of the American Association of Endodontists. He is currently the Director of the Advanced Education Program in Endodontics at NYU and practices endodontics in private practice in Manhattan. He is involved with several research projects which focus on pain, Regenerative Endodontics, and Invasive Cervical Resorption of the root which he has the most interest. He lectures frequently to local, national, and international communities on these topics and is currently involved with a few clinical research projects on the subject of Invasive Cervical Resorption and Regenerative Endodontics. Dr. Malek is the author/co-author of several peer-reviewed articles and chapters in prominent endodontic journals and textbooks.
